Reading Intervention Placement and Assessment Protocol for all incoming freshmen and sophomores students:

- **Step 1 AIMSweb MAZE Universal Screener** all incoming freshmen or sophomores who scored below target on the MAZE universal screener on their fall and/or winter assessments during their 8th or 9th grade years will be targeted for further testing. Any incoming freshmen or sophomores with no prior data will be given the AIMSweb MAZE Universal Screener.
- **Step 2- Language! Placement Test** –all incoming students identified in step one will be given the Language! Placement Test to validate and determine the appropriate placement for intervention.
- **Step 3- Language! Intervention Placement** –students who place using the Language! Placement Test will enroll in the appropriate intervention level.
- **Step 4- AIMSweb MAZE Universal Screener** all freshmen students will take the MAZE during Fall, Winter, and Spring Assessment windows.

Reading Intervention Placement and Assessment Protocol for freshmen not receiving the Language! Reading intervention program:

- **Step 1- AIMSweb MAZE Universal Screener** all freshmen students will take the MAZE during Fall, Winter, and Spring Assessment windows.
- **Step 2 –AIMSweb MAZE Rescreening –**all freshmen not currently receiving reading intervention who fall below the target will be rescreened for validation.
- **Step 3 AIMSweb RCBM-** all freshmen not currently receiving reading intervention who fall below the target on the second screener will be administered the AIMSweb RCBM.
- **Step 4 Language! Placement Test** –all freshmen who fall below target on two or more AIMSweb screeners will be given the Language! Placement Test to validate the need for intervention.
- **Step 5- Language! Intervention Placement** –students who place using the Language! Placement Test will enroll in the appropriate intervention level.
- **Step 6- Progress Monitoring –** All students placed for intervention will be given both the norm referenced and curriculum progress monitoring assessments throughout their placement in intervention.
- **Step 7- AIMSweb QPS** students in intervention who do not show progress on one or more norm referenced progress monitors may be given the QPS to further inform instruction.

Exit Criteria for Reading Intervention Students:

- Step 1: Student demonstrates mastery on all norm referenced progress monitors used for intervention students.
- Step 2: Student meets target on the AIMSweb MAZE Universal screener validating the progress monitoring results.
